#### Why Plant a tree?

1. Trees shade the roads and sidewalks and can reduce temperatures by up to 20 degrees
2. Trees can help improve the overall air quality
3. Trees add to the value of your property
4. Trees reduce the amount of carbon dioxide in the air around us and replace it with oxygen which is necessary for our survival.
5. The roots of trees also stabilize the soil and help prevent the ground from washing away in severe rain storms. This ultimately contributes to improving soil quality and preventing soil erosion.

7:00 pm program starts

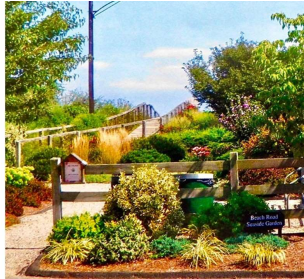
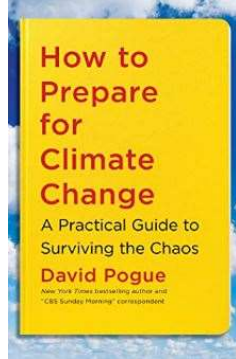
Come hear about issues that impact our beach neighborhood and meet your neighbors - All are welcome!
