There will be a slightly higher tide than usual and a coastal flood warning has been issued Southern Fairfield-Southern Westchester-  
326 PM EDT Wed Jul 13 2022

...COASTAL FLOOD STATEMENT REMAINS IN EFFECT FROM MIDNIGHT  
TONIGHT TO 2 AM EDT THURSDAY...

\* WHAT...Up to one half foot of inundation above ground level  
expected in vulnerable areas near the waterfront and shoreline.

\* WHERE...In Connecticut, Southern Fairfield County. In New  
York, Southern Westchester County.

\* WHEN...Late tonight.

\* IMPACTS...Brief minor flooding of the more vulnerable  
locations near the waterfront and shoreline.

PRECAUTIONARY/PREPAREDNESS ACTIONS...

Do not drive through flooded roadways.
